PATHWAY FOR PARENTS

From time to time, parents and carers may have concerns about their son or daughter's education and/or wellbeing at school. Quite often this is due to a misunderstanding about school policy or practice. Sometimes the pupil may be behaving unusually at home or at school and/or expressing their own concerns. Whatever the situation, we would encourage you, and/or your child, to **talk to us about it at the earliest opportunity** so that we can help sort out the problem.

If it is your child's academic progress that you wish to speak to us about, or if it is an issue around your child's wellbeing (for example, bullying or other anxiety), please ask to see their teacher in the first instance or make an appointment, through the School Office, telephone number 01245 353755, or via our Parent email address: <u>Parents@ourladyimmaculate.essex.sch.uk</u> or in person at Reception.

Our Lady Immaculate School emphasises the partnership between parents, church and school and the majority of concerns can be dealt with through informal contacts, usually with the class teacher and, sometimes, the Headteacher. Most concerns and complaints can be sorted out quickly by speaking with your child's class teacher.

If, having spoken to the class teacher, you still have concerns, you should see the Headteacher who will look into the problem and discuss their findings with you so that we can find a way forward together which serves the best interest of both the school and your child.

MENU WEEK COMMENCING - 13th January – Week 3

Please check the menu as there is a change in food choices.

Please refer to the menus on our website so the children are aware and know what to choose when asked by their teachers. Please use the online payment system to pay for all dinners (Years 3 to 6). Please note there is a change of new and exciting dishes on the menu.

Please see the Notice board for the special menu on Thursday 16th January in place of Cottage Pie.

Please encourage your child in KS1 to try a free school meal on Thursday 16th January. Our school meals service is excellent and provides delicious, balanced and nourishing food on a daily basis. If possible, please support the school by choosing a Universal Free School meal for infants on this day. If you have any queries, please contact the school office.

The revised menu for next Thursday 16th January 2020 will be:

Chicken Nuggets (made from breast of chicken), Golden Footballs (Pomme Noisettes)

Salad Bar, Baked Beans, Sweetcorn

Or alternatively a Jacket Potato.

Dessert will be an 'Ice Cream Factory' with sprinkles, choc drops, wafers, marshmallow, raisins and sauces or fresh fruit salad. There will be an alternative non-milk ice cream for those pupils with allergies.

Is your child eligible for this award—Free School Meals?

In order for the school to receive the Pupil Premium funding, a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- **Income Support** •
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 •
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Universal Credit.

Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

You will have noticed that it's new menu time again! We have tried to keep it to children's favourites, without comprising National school food standards. This ensures children get a variety of healthy, homemade

(where possible) main meals and desserts. Indeed, children always have a selection of hot vegetables, salad and fresh fruit to accompany their meal. Pupil feedback is very important to us which is why we have made the decision to keep Jacket Potatoes on as a daily alternative. In so doing, the children always have accessibility to a hot meal if the main choice is something they are not very keen on. I am sure, as parents, you can appreciate how hard it is to please approximately 170 children's taste buds every dav!

Please try to look at the menus and discuss them with your children. Why not get your child to ask for a small sample if they are concerned they won't like something; Mrs Flynn is always happy to oblige and encourage children to try new things!

Kindly note that the zipped hoodie is for junior outdoor games lessons only and is not to be worn in place of the sweatshirt or coat. As you are probably aware, School Trends was taken over by another company earlier this year and they have changed the delivery service to be a "Direct to Parent" service. This means there is no minimum order and everything will be delivered direct to your door for a small delivery charge of only £2.99. As a result of this, you can place an order any time without having to stick to monthly deadlines and your orders will be processed and dispatched on an individual basis.

THE ARK & AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITY CLUBS

New change to booking of clubs - when selecting a club, the selection will automatically book your child for the entire period the club runs and payment will need to be made when the booking is done. No dates will appear in the booking log. The total amount will be display rather than per session.

Club bookings can no longer be made as and when, they have to book for the entire session and the payment made will be for all the sessions. No refunds will be issued if a session is missed.

The next list of clubs for SPRING 1 has been added and ready to book.

It is imperative that you always **BOOK** your child onto the relevant club sessions for the entire period/ term the club runs prior to making payment, as this is the only way to ensure your child has a place. N.B. Children can stay in The Ark at the cost of £4.25 per hour – at very short notice but please inform the office accordingly.

We do understand that there may be situations where your child is unable to attend a club, but please note we cannot refund any monies for missed sessions.
