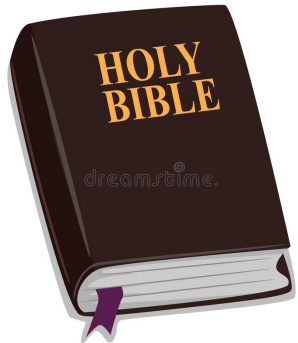


# Year 2

**BIG QUESTION:** How work together to make our family happy?



**Act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with our God. (Micah 6:8)**
