For this we give thanks. Amen (by Colleen Hanycz)







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
BIG QUESTION: How can we help those that need us the most?



In October 202 Pope Francis wrote the encyclical Frattelli Tutti which is the Italian for "All Brothers and Sisters". In it Pope Francis tells us that we need to build a more just and fraternal world.

The title refers to the quote from St Francis of Assisi, "Brother Sun and Sister Moon".

"How important it is to dream together... By ourselves, we risk seeing mirages, things that are not there. Dreams, on the other hand, are built together. Let us dream, then, as a human single family, as fellow travellers sharing the same flesh, as children of the same earth which is our common home, each of us bringing the richness of his or her beliefs and convictions, each of us with his or her own voice, brothers and sisters all."
