During Monday's worship assembly, the children thought about who they look to in times of trouble. In an age appropriate way, the children were informed about the different forms of abuse, including bullying. They talked about the kinds of worries that children may have and about the importance of speaking to a trusted adult if they were worried about anything.

On Wednesday, the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors led a whole school assembly, adopting this year's theme 'Reach Out.

The children spoke with confidence about the need to treat each other with dignity and respect, and importantly to stand up to bullying by speaking out. The children were reminded about where to find the OLI worry box, and Buddy, the NSPCC mascot, made a special appearance, reassuring children that difficult times never need to be dealt with alone.

On Monday, our Year Five children led a very moving Remembrance Day assembly.



#### Is your child eligible for this award - Free School Meals?

In order for the school to receive the Pupil Premium funding, a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- Income Support / Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Universal Credit.

Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get). **Further information can be found on** https://www.essex.gov.uk/freeschool-meals

#### New Parents— September 2023 Admissions

The application period for admission to Foundation class for September 2023 opened on 7th November 2022.
