Dear Parents and Carers,

It was lovely to see children and staff return after the Easter holiday looking refreshed, rested and ready for the summer term.

During Monday's Prayer and Liturgy assembly, the children were introduced to our new Virtue to live by: **Resilience**. Given that the summer term is the final stretch until the finish line, it seems aptly appropriate!

Indeed, we always expect the children to step it up, give of their best and rise to the challenges of their final term in the academic year. This is a particularly significant term for our Year 6 children as they continue to prepare themselves for the next chapter in their lives.

During the assembly, the children reflected on what we mean by the word *Resilience*. They learned that to be resilient is to accept that there will be difficulties in life; to see these as a challenge and not to be discouraged. The children understood from this that when we persevere, even when we have doubts, in our hearts we remain committed.

The children identified several signs of **Resilience**, including not letting doubts stop them from trying, not being afraid because they know they are not alone, and asking God for help in growing through personal challenges. They also recognised the importance of taking one step at a time, completing what they start, and being a reliable classmate.

Finally, despite a decline in successful applications across the education sector, I am thrilled to share with you the news that the school has been awarded the funds to build a much-needed porch and secure perimeter fencing.

I cannot express enough how delighted I am about the positive impact this will have on our school community, creating a safer and more secure environment for our children and our staff.

This is my **fourth** successful bid since I began my headship at Our Lady Immaculate in 2019, but for me, the one I am most proud of!

Is your child eligible for this award - Free School Meals?

In order for the school to receive the Pupil Premium funding, a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- Income Support / Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Universal Credit.

Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get). **Further information can be found on** https://www.essex.gov.uk/freeschool-meals

DROP OFF AND PICK UP PARKING

Church Car Park and Staff Car Park (in front of school)
