### Is your child eligible for this award - Free School Meals?

In order for the school to receive the Pupil Premium funding, a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- Income Support / Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Universal Credit.

# New secondary admission round (Year 6 to 7 transfer September 2025)

The application period for admission to Year 7 in secondary schools for September 2024 opened on Thursday,12 September 2024.

From this date, parents/carers of current Year 6 Essex resident children will be able to make their applications using our website <a href="https://www.essex.gov.uk/admissions">www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</a>. Last year, 99% of Essex parents applied online.


As usual, the Council will not be sending out letters to parents/carers about applying. All of the application information is published on the website above.
